Recyclables should be clean, empty and dry

Simple steps to recycling success

- Is it recyclable? Use your Union City Recycles buddy bag to collect recyclables listed in this guide.
- Rinse and empty all food and liquids.
- Please NO food leftovers, disposable diapers, plastic bags (unless bagged in clear plastic bag) and other garbage.
- Use the buddy bag to carry mixed recyclables to the recycling cart or dumpster at your complex.

Union City Recycles buddy bags are available through your property manager



Food Scrap Collection Easy and Convenient!

- Separate food waste while preparing meals, scraping plates and cleaning the fridge.
- Use the free kitchen pail, or any compostable paper container such as take-out boxes or paper bags, to collect food scraps
- Include food soiled paper such as paper plates and cups, napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes, etc.
- Empty your food waste into the green organics cart or dumpster at your complex & keep pail for reuse.

Contact the property manager to request a free kitchen pail.

Mixed Paper (Magazines, Newspaper, Office Paper, Junk Mail, Cardboard, Milk Cartons), Clean Aluminium Foil & Trays, Glass, Metal Cans, Aseptic Containers, Plastic Bottles, Plastic containers 1-7, Shredded Paper (in paper or clear plastic bag), Plastic Bags and Shrink Wrap (must be bagged in clear plastic bag), Paperback Books, Empty Aerosol Cans, Pots & Pans



✘ No: Trash, Styrofoam, Food Waste and Food-Soiled Paper, Plant Debris, Wood, Pallets, Film Plastics, Restroom Waste, Hazardous and Medical Waste, Mirrors, Ceramics, Textiles, Concrete, Construction Debris, Asphalt, Dirt

Organics



Food Scraps (meats, fruits, vegetables, seafood, egg shells, dairy products), Coffee Filters & Grounds, Waxed Cardboard, Napkins, Paper Towels, Paper Plates & Cups, Pizza Boxes, Untreated Wood, All Yard Trimmings (Small Branches, Leaves, Grass, Plants, Weeds, Brush)



✘ No: Trash or Recyclable Material, E-Waste, Restroom Waste, Hazardous or Medical Waste, Palm Fronds, Liquids/Oil/Grease, Construction Debris, Concrete, Asphalt, Dirt, Diapers, Pet Waste, Plastic Bags, Plastic Containers

Landfill



Non-Recyclables, Non-Organics. Styrofoam Containers & Shipment Packaging, Glass/Mirrors (if packaged safely), Toys, Ceramics, Carpet/Rugs, Clothing, Diapers, Pet Waste, Hangers, and Painted, Stained, or Pressure-Treated Wood



✘ No: Batteries, Fluorescent Tubes, Hazardous and Medical Waste, Sharps (Needles, Syringes), Liquids/Oil/Grease, Appliances and Electronics, Concrete, Asphalt, Dirt, Construction Debris, Tires
